## Summary of Experience

Richard Paul has wide-ranging international experience as a partner with Rogers Stirk Harbour + Partners and has managed large teams of architects on major schemes worldwide. He has been key to the development of the practice's work in the Far East and is currently working on a number of schemes in China.

Richard championed the design of Tower 3, a 75-storey mixed-use office building at the heart of the World Trade Center redevelopment in New York and was director in charge of the design evolution of Canary Riverside, the new European Headquarter for a major investment bank.

Richard has a well-recognised reputation for outstanding leadership and innovation. He promotes excellence in the design of sustainable architecture which fundamentally underpins the RSHP design philosophy. An example of this can be seen at Chiswick Park which is an energy efficient, low cost, truly sustainable environment which sets the benchmark for this building typology throughout the UK and Europe.

Richard was previously a board director of Fosters and Partners where he worked on The Hong Kong and Shanghai Bank Headquarters in Hong Kong where he also lived for a number of years.
